### Maxwell Water Update:

Register for email alerts at [www.maxwellwsc.com](http://www.maxwellwsc.com). Also be sure to READ the message at the BOTTOM of your water bill each month. The Texas Public Utilities Commission (PUC) has authorized water companies to resume late fees and disconnections that were that were put on hold in March due to COVID19. No late fees have been charged for water in March, April, May, or June.

Maxwell Water Supply Corporation will resume late fee charges in August. Disconnections may also resume in August as needed. If you think you might need a payment plan, please contact the Maxwell office NOW to request assistance. ### Free COVID Testing:

Free testing will be conducted in Hays County by the Texas Division of Emergency Management and the Texas Army National Guard at San Marcos High School at 2601 Rattler Road off McCarty Lane in San Marcos. No pre-registrations or symptoms are required. Anyone age 5 and older can participate in this walk-up service from Sunday July 12 to Thursday July 16 from 8am to 4pm daily. Stay safe. Stay home if you can. Get tested if desired.
